ETF & Mutual Fund Rankings: All Cap Value Style

The All Cap Value style ranks second out of the twelve fund styles as detailed in our <u>2Q20 Style Ratings for ETFs and Mutual Funds</u> report. <u>Last quarter</u>, the All Cap Value style ranked first. It gets our Attractive rating, which is based on an aggregation of ratings of 43 ETFs and 477 mutual funds in the All Cap Value style as of April 21, 2020. Figures 1 and 2 show the five best and worst rated ETFs and mutual funds in the style. Not all All Cap Value style ETFs and mutual funds are created the same. The number of holdings varies widely (from 15 to 1661). This variation creates drastically different investment implications and, therefore, ratings.

Redwood AlphaFactor Tactical Core Fund (RWTIX, RWTNX) is excluded from Figure 2 because its total net assets (TNA) are below \$100 million and do not meet our liquidity minimums.

American Century STOXX U.S. Quality Value ETF (VALQ) is the top-rated All Cap Value ETF and Brown Advisory – Beutel Goodman Large Cap Value Fund (BVALX) is the top-rated All Cap Value mutual fund. Both earn a Very Attractive rating.

First Trust Dorsey Wright Momentum & Low Volatility ETF (DVOL) is the worst rated All Cap Value ETF and Wells Fargo Diversified Equity Fund (NVDAX) is the worst rated All Cap Value mutual fund. Both earn an Unattractive rating.



Figure 3: Separating the Best ETFs from the Worst Funds


